

Seed Balls

Steps

1. Mix 1 part clay with 1 part compost and 1 part worm castings.
2. Add in seeds for different ball mixes.
 - a. Nitrogen fixer mix
 - i. One large seed per ball (pigeon pea, indigo, henna, cowpea)
 - ii. Handful of smaller seeds (fenugreek, alfalfa, clover, millet)
 - b. Beneficial insect mix
 - i. Handful of mixed seeds (borage, buckwheat, parsley, chervil, coriander, dill, fennel, chicory, rocket etc)
3. Add water in slowly until the mix forms a tight ball that holds together
4. Create small balls of clay (truffle size)
5. Mark balls with letters to let us know what type they are
 - a. Nitrogen fixers mix balls mark with the letters NF
 - b. Beneficial insect mix mark with the letters BI
6. Place on tray to dry
